

Kitsap Work Week 2015 at Train Mountain Railroad

The Kitsap work week at Train Mountain Railroad started on April 12, 2015 with the arrival of the Kitsap work crew. In attendance were Jerry Crane, Jim Davenport, Dennis Weaver, Dick Peterson, Dave White, Bob Brown and Jeff Mills. Jim and Jerry made the long trip to Southern California to pick up a load of steel rail for the replacement track at Rabbit Run. They took two long days to arrive at RMI in Oxnard and return to Train Mountain by 11:45 PM Monday, the 13th.

Bob Brown helped Jeff prepare fire tools to put on the gators and the fire gondolas. Russ Wood put the finishing touches on three Fire Danger Level signs which were later installed at high visibility points by Bob and Jeff. Jim headed up a crew consisting of Bob Brown and Dave White and worked on some bad track in Crisp yard, then moved on to rebuilding and redesigning a three way switch at the turn table yard. During this time Dick Peterson and Jeff Mills painted the newly finished east wall in the Hall of Flags, a job which required the manlift to complete.

Jerry tracked down a short in the lighting at Crisp Yard which was back feeding the power to the lights making the on/off switch inoperable.

With this corrected Jerry installed a new outside light over the new cargo doors at Central Station. More track work was done along with many more small tasks accomplished.

Dennis Weaver was our go-to-man; running errands and keeping the work crews busy. One of the greatest moments of the work week was when Bob volunteered to help Debra to clean out the mill foil in the pond behind the wood shop. He got into the cold waist deep pond and was eagerly scooping out the unwanted Milfoil.

The week was highlighted Thursday night with an excellent Pot Roast dinner prepared and sponsored by the Ward family. They made sure we were all well-feed. The Work Week ended with the crew patching cracks in parking lot near Central Station.

Then Jim steamed up Number 9 and took a group out for a Saturday afternoon excursion. This ride was documented by Tom Watson and can be viewed on Trainmountain. org by going to the Video section and selecting videos by Tom Watson. During this work week, many tasks were completed but there is an <u>urgent</u> need for *more* work to be completed before the Triennial.

We also need Station agents which are hourly shifts. The station agent helps load and unload trains, Assists with depot sales and helps give the safety briefing.






