## President's Wessage by Tom Huffman

Greetings from the President

This is the letter that I attached to our annual report to Jim Dunwiddle of the Kitsap Advisory Board.

March 15 2016

Mr. James Dunwiddle

It's my pleasure to introduce myself to you as the new president of Kitsap Live Steamers. As required by the new draft agreement. The attachments include our Insurance contract naming KCPS as named insured, 2016 events calendar, and the 2015year end Treasurer's report. Budgeting for 2016 is still in the planning stage and is balanced on the approval of the track and building expansion. Kitsap Live Steamers has been planning on expanding our track by 2000 feet and starting this project as soon as our proposal is completed and approved by the Parks Board. The only other large capital project is an addition to our storage building. We are currently using two trailer conex boxes. These boxes just don't fit in with the appearance of well-kept park and rail road maintenance facility. Startup date on that project is relative to our cash available. Projections of a start date could possibly be as early as 2018.

Kitsap Live Steamers has been located in the South Kitsap Park for 20 years providing free train rides to the public. We also provide a special train while events are held at the park. Most notably is the Easter Egg run, and the Halloween Ghost Train. I have also discussed the possibly of providing rides for the special needs students with South Kitsap School District. The train route is a 1 mile, 10-minute ride that transports the public through the forest, show cases it's beauty, and the hobby of large scale model rail roads. The trees, animals, and forest floor growth are an amazement to the passengers who haven't experienced a forest in its natural settings. Kitsap Live Steamers recognizes the seriousness of our responsibly, and stewardship of South Kitsap Park. In order to keep our commitment to this natural resource, and our track right of way for a safe trip we have decided to reorganize our director positions, and have implemented a new select director as our Grounds person. This new position chaired by a Board Member will work personally with park representatives, supervise and train our members on the proper safety procedures, and land stewardship practices. We want the public to continue this experience, enjoy the natural beauty of the park, educational example of proper stewardship, and the hobby of live steaming miniature rail roads.

The Buildings and Grounds Committee has been divided with Ted Karanson taking on the Grounds responsibilities and myself working on the Buildings and Yard Equipment. The workday of 27 Feb saw pretty good attendance and quite a bit of progress with continued cleanup around the yard as well as;

- Work on storage for the new riding cars progressing in the car barn headed up by George Hoke.
- Repairs to the rail wheel bench by Eric Meehan and myself.
- New bottom seals to all three roll up doors in the Thomson Building.
- Procured a spiffy new trash can in the loading bay area.
- Powered, non-powered and electric transfer tables inspected and lubricated.
- Working on estimates for replacement of the loading/unloading area roof replacement.

#### Unfortunately there is still much to do such as;

- Replace the loading/unloading area roof.
- Replace lights in the loading/unloading area.
- Clean Thomson Bldg Roof and Gutters.
- Clean Depot Roof and Gutters.


### Membership
