### A sampling of work completed in November:

- Replaced worn frog at switch M-4 (middle loop, West side).
- Post Ghost Run cleanup accomplished.
- Added dry wall and protective plywood to the East and West walls of the Thomson building.
- Designed and manufactured an installation gauge apparatus for the new steel frogs.
- Procured a new steel depot storage box for the Thomson building.
- Painted the new drywall in the Thomson building.
- Stained the protective plywood on the new drywall in the Thomson building.
- Installed a large storage shelf on the East wall of the Thomson building.

### Upcoming Plans:

- Continue building a Wye turn around system at the West side of the Middle (Short)Loop.
- Replace aluminum frogs with steel frogs as they become available.
- Construct a Maintenance/Storage Building in the KLS Yard Compound.
- Construct a rain shelter covered maintenance area in the Yard Compound.
- Drywall the Thompson building meeting area East and West Walls.
- Install two riser style water hydrants at the depot.

Return the hydraulic lift to the fully lowered position, turn it off and lock the switch when done.

Equipment will last much longer if we take care of it!

## “On Track” By Bill Hartung Track Committee Chairman

During the Ghost Train event in late October we suffered a broken control rod between the control stand and the points of depot switch number one. Bob Noecker stuck with the job of routing trains into the depot all night, in that awful weather, using a wrench to move the points back and forth. So repair of the broken rod was the first item we attacked during the November 10 work day. We were fortunate to have replacement rods already on hand, so all we needed to do was pull out the broken pieces, install the new one, and make sure the mechanism was still in adjustment. *Thanks go to Mark Wright, and to Frank Zink and his son James for helping get this job done.*

The switch for the wye, the original left-hander that we’ve already built, is waiting for the point control lock pieces and then we will install it. After continuing discussions we’ve determined that the new LH switch can work at the north end of the wye, so we’re almost ready to get the wye completed. Photos accompanying this article show progress on the diamond crossing in the shop at Hobart Car and Foundry. Courtney Jones has machined all the pieces and started welding it all together. I anticipate it will be ready to take to the park in December.
