Full Steam Ahead!

Work done by our yard and track crews in June mainly focused on repairing worn track and continuing to get the foundation ready for the new metal maintenance building.

A sampling of the work completed in June:

- Installed ½ inch spacers on the 600 series cars to allow more ground clearance and prevent scraping from ground contact. (Ted Svensen)
- Changed the tire of the bell wheel on the unpowered track transfer table. (Greg Slobodzian)
- Fixed sticking Yard / Car Barn Siding kick switch.
- Removed, painted, lubed and reinstalled the stuck gravel hopper drop gate to get it working again. (Ted Svendsen, Greg Slobodzian)
- Replaced 30ft of wooden track panels under the gravel hopper.
- Trimmed weeds and cleaned debris on the main line. (Dan Simmons)
- Replaced 40 feet of worn aluminum rail with new steel rail. (Greg Slobodzian)
- Built forms for a concrete terrace for the BBO and tables. (Steve Tinner, Greg Slobodzian)



Thanks Tom Huffman, Greg Slobodzian. Dan Simmons, Steve Tinner, Bill Hartung, and all the other members who donate their valuable time and efforts to the KLS railroad.



Upcoming Plans:

- Continue to replace aluminum frogs with steel frogs as they become available.
- Construct the Maintenance/Storage Building in the KLS Yard Compound.
- Install new locking table support hinges on the four depot tables.
- Build new track.






We had a visit from the Fire Inspector.

SUMMER SAFETY UPDATE

Heat, Stress and Kids

We are now entering the hottest months of the year. We need to be careful to stay hydrated and stay aware of potential hazards with the heat. When we are running our trains, we can be out in the elements for hours at a time. As a result, our bodies tend to lose SAFET hydration faster and this can lead to heat related illnesses, such as heat stroke. If you feel dizzy, sick or see someone showing signs of disorientation or fatigue, please get yourself or them into the shade to let the body cool down while providing plenty of water/hydration (not coffee or energy drinks!). We are also in the sun for prolonged periods of time, please wear your sunscreen.

You will notice the lines are getting longer and the push to get our riders along is ever increasing. It can be stressful for some and you may be pushed to keep running longer than you feel able to do. Please be aware of our new regu-

lations, we will only be allowing train crews to run 2 hours before requiring a half hour rest. We need everybody to be both physically and mentally healthy so

we can keep this railway running as well as it has been. If you are not feeling well, please put your health first.

Lastly, this month
we have been noticing
a lot of younger kids who
have been left unattended
in the work areas/yard to run

around. Please keep track of all kids. It can be very dangerous if a kid were to dart out in front of a moving train or if they were to trip and fall over the tracks. Also, if kids are using the ride-on "human powered" rail equipment, please have them put them back where they belong. I've seen these pieces left out multiple times, sometimes right in the main traffic areas where trains enter and leave the yard.
